

A. Introduction

The following sections contain detailed information on how to complete the Single Entry document and the actions to be taken when presenting the declaration to Customs. The form has been designed to replace most of the Customs declaration forms currently in use in Kenya. The Single Entry document will replace the Customs forms listed below and will be used for all types of declaration i.e. imports, exports, warehousing and transit.

It is important that the Single Entry Document (SED) is completed as fully as possible and accurately so as to avoid delays and possible penalties. The person completing the Single Entry declaration, the declarant, must also ensure that the goods and/or the importer/ exporter are entitled to the
