No.	CLARIFICATION	KRA RESPONSES
1.	No. 1: In case of a contractor arrangement between a foreign entity and a local entity where the foreign entity is the main tenderer that will subcontract the 40% contract value to the local entity, would a power attorney be required from both entities?, Please also clarify the main purpose of the power of attorney.	Prospective bidders MUST note, in the event that the tenderer comprises of a contractual arrangement between a foreign entity and a local entity the following provisions apply: TDS 3.9: If the Supplier is a Joint Venture of two or more firms, all such firms shall be jointly and severally bound to KRA for the fulfilment of the provisions of the Contract and shall designate one of such firms to act as a leader with authority to bind the Joint Venture. The composition or constitution of the Joint Venture shall not be altered without the prior consent of KRA.
		TDS 23.4: In case the Tenderer is a JV, the Tender shall be signed by an authorized representative of the JV on behalf of the JV, and so as to be legally binding on all the members as evidenced by a power of attorney signed by their legally authorized representatives.
		We require a written agreement establishing the contractual arrangement as a J.V, the agreement should authorise the nomination and appointment of a natural person who will be authorised to sign documents on behalf of the JV as well as negotiate a contract in the event of success.
2.	No. 2: In the case of a contract/ subcontractor arrangements as envisioned above, which mandatory documents should be filled, signed and stamped by the local entity, foreign entity or both?.	Prospective bidders MUST meet all the evaluation criteria Requirements as provided in the tender document. Both parties must comply with mandatory requirements (MR) on page 26 of the tender document item MR 1,3,4,6,8,12 and 13 while the lead partner will avail the rest.

No. 3: In reference to point 4.10 and 3. 44.6 of the Standard Tender "Foreign related to Document. tenderers are required to source at least forty (40%) percent of their contract inputs..." Is requirement strictly mandatory? This point, considering that, based on the tender document, we meet all commercial, operational, technical requirements in full; and considering that, to our knowledge, there are no local companies in Kenya that could provide or support us in any of the major components and requirements of our system and operation, thus making it very difficult to comply with the "40%" requirement

The firm shall not earn any preference as indicated. All interested firms are eligible. No firm shall be disqualified for missing this requirement.

SECTION I - INSTRUCTIONS TO TENDERERS (ITT) item 4.10 on page 3

Foreign tenderers are required to source at least forty (40%) percent of their contract inputs (in supplies, subcontracts and labor) from national suppliers and contractors. To this end, a foreign tenderer shall provide in its tender documentary evidence that this requirement is met. Foreign tenderers not meeting this criterion will automatically disqualified. Information required to enable KRA determine if this condition is met, shall be provided in for this purpose is be provided in "SECTION **EVALUATION** AND QUALIFICATION CRITERIA, Item 9".

> The firm shall not earn any preference as indicated above. All interested firms are therefore eligible. No firm shall be disqualified for missing the local sourcing requirement.

Please note the provisions of the TDS 4.11;"a tenderer is considered a foreign tenderer, if it is registered in Kenya, has less than 51 percent ownership by nationals of Kenya and if it does not subcontract foreign contractors more than 10 percent of the contract price, excluding provisional sums. JVs are considered as foreign tenderers if the individual member firms are registered in Kenya have less than 51 percent ownership by nationals of Kenya. The JV shall not subcontract to foreign firms more than 10 percent
